States that Have Already Banned Lead in Children's Products

- **Michigan** SB 174- Banned sale of children's products with a lead content of 0.6 percent or more.
- **Tennessee** passed the Child Toxic Substance Protection Act of 2008, which bans products with lead content of 0.06 percent.

State Pursuing Ban on Lead in Children's Products

- **Washington** SB 6530- Bans children's products with a lead content greater than 40 ppm, in addition to other toxins
- **Connecticut**- HB 5601- Bans children's products with lead concentrations greater than 40 ppm, in addition to other toxins.
- **Vermont**- SB 152- Bans children's products with lead concentrations greater than 0.01 percent by weight.
- **Maryland**- HB 62 ban certain lead-containing children's products or lead-adulterated consumable products.
- **Illinois**- HB 5705 bans lead in children's products at 40 ppm

A bi-partisan bill has just been introduced in the U.S. Senate by Senator Mark Pryor (D-AR), Senator Ted Stevens (R-AK) and Sen. Daniel Inouye (D-HI) to ban lead in all children's products
